If every unemployed person in the Midwest was placed into an open job, there would still be more than 180,000 unfilled positions, according to the most recent U.S. Labor Department data. The 12-state region is the only area of the country where job openings outnumber out-of-work job seekers.




# **South Dakota's Education System:**
