## SUMMARY

This annual report updates the tuition and fees prices published by all of the public higher education institutions in the WICHE member states. It is the product of an annual survey administered to the SHEEO offices in each state, with a couple of exceptions. There is not a centralized coordinating or governing body for the two-year colleges in Arizona or for the technical institutes in South Dakota, and so individuals at the individual institutions in those two states responded to this survey. Copies of the survey instructions can be found at the end of this report.

### Key Findings

Average tuition and fees for resident undergraduates in 2008-09 at public four-year institutions in the WICHE region were \$5,094, an increase over the previous year of \$300 (6.3 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average resident undergraduate tuition in the region was 3.3 percent over 2007-08. Tuition and fees for resident in-district students at public two-year colleges in the WICHE states, excluding California, averaged \$2,505 in 2008-09, an increase of \$110 (4.6 percent), or 1.7 percent after adjusting for inflation.

Non-resident undergraduates at public four-year institutions in the region paid an average of \$15,447 in 2008-09, an increase over the previous year of \$754 (5.1 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average non-resident undergraduate tuition in the region was 2.2 percent over 2007-08. Non-resident students at public two-year colleges in the WICHE states, averaged \$6,822 for tuition and fees in 2008-09, an increase of \$464 (7.3 percent), or a 4.3 percent increase after adjusting for inflation.

Tuition and fees for resident graduates in 2008-09 at public four-year institutions averaged \$6,666, an increase over the previous year of \$535 (8.7 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average resident graduate tuition in the region was 5.6 percent over the 2007-08 school year. Average tuition and fees for non-resident graduates in 2008-09 at public four-year institutions in the region were \$16,710, an increase over the previous year of \$916 (5.8 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average non-resident graduate tuition in the region was 2.8 percent over 2007-08.

## Endnotes

- [1] Average annual increases in tuition and fees are presented with and without California (w/o CA).
- [2] California institutions were excluded from all calculations because the large number of two-year colleges and the historically low matriculation fee structure distort regional patterns.
- [3] The Consumer Price Index (CPI) reflects changes in the price of a fixed basket of goods and services that are purchased by consumers in general. The CPI is the seasonally adjusted Consumer Price Index—Urban (July to July) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- [4] In 2008-09, Alaska resident students are charged \$134 per credit hour for lower division credits, \$151 per upper division credits, and \$301 per credit for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters.
- [5] Only for University of Alaska Fairbanks, all undergraduate and graduate students taking nine or more credits, all students living in university housing, and all students paying the Health Center fee must be covered by a health insurance plan. The student health insurance fee in 2008-09 is \$945 per year or \$352 per semester. However students who are covered by an alternative health insurance plan may waive the student health insurance plan.
- [6] Arizona charges additional fees for certain programs: law, pharmacy, nursing, engineering, selected master's degree programs, and undergraduate degree programs at ASU and the UA.
- [7] Rates shown for undergraduate resident students at ASU (all campuses) and NAU are for new students starting Fall 2008; different rates apply to existing students. For ASU, new undergraduate resident student rates will increase no more than 5% annually until 5 years after admission as a freshman; for NAU new undergraduate (resident and nonresident) student rates reflect a Block Tuition Program that keep base tuition rates unchanged (for each cohort) for 4 years.
- [8] California State University, Channel Islands opened in 2002-03.
- [9] California State University, Hayward announced in January 2005 that it would change its name to California State University, East Bay.
- [10] Undergraduate students at the University of California are required to show proof of health insurance, effective Fall 2001. Undergraduate totals do not include waivable health insurance fees.
- [11] University of California, Merced opened in 2005-06.
- [12] University of California, San Francisco offers one undergraduate program in dental hygiene. The undergraduate program is undergoing review, and new enrollments have been suspended during the review.

- [13] The resident undergraduate tuition amounts for all Colorado institutions do not include the \$2,760 voucher for which all Colorado residents taking a full-time undergraduate course load of 30 credit hours at public institutions in Colorado are eligible. Beginning with the 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state will receive an estimated \$92 per credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions during the 2008-09 academic year as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process (<http://www.collegeincolorado.org/COF/default.aspx>).
- [14] Prior to 2003, Colorado State University-Pueblo was the University of Southern Colorado.
- [15] Higher rates apply to certain fields.
- [16] Upper division undergraduate students pay a higher tuition rate.
- [17] Effective AY 2003-04, Hilo discontinued its lower division tuition rate. Hilo undergraduate students previously enrolled in AY 2002-03 as classified freshmen or classified sophomores and continuing their enrollment in Fall 2003 as classified freshmen or classified sophomores were grandfathered in at a lower rate (\$1,792 for residents and \$7,408 for non-residents) for AY 2003-04.
- [18] The 2005 Idaho Legislature changed state law (House Bill 231, Idaho Code 33-3717) regarding the charging of "tuition" to resident undergraduate students. Previously, Idaho statute did not allow the cost of instruction to be charged to resident undergraduates who were charged a "matriculation fee" instead. Beginning July 1, 2005, Boise State University, Idaho State University, and Lewis-Clark State College charge "tuition fees" instead of a "matriculation fee." Matriculation fees will continue to be charged to resident undergraduates at the University of Idaho because the Idaho constitution would have to be amended to effect a similar change at that institution.
- [19] The lower division rate for a full-time resident student is reported here. For 2008-09, upper division students paid \$5,204 at Montana State University, Northern; \$6,180 at Montana Tech of the University of Montana; \$5,574 at the University of Montana, Missoula; and \$4,780 at Western Montana College of the University of Montana.
- [20] Nevada State College opened in 2002-03.
- [21] Mayville State University includes \$854 notebook computer fee. A significant change occurred in 2006-07, when non-resident students will be charged 1.5 times the resident rate, rather than the previous charge of 2.67 times the resident rate.
- [22] Valley City State University includes a \$902 notebook computer fee. Valley City State University undergraduate tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 15 credits per semester.

- [23] In academic year 2008-09, EOU, PSU, SOU and WOU incorporated all undergrad and graduate universal and programmatic resource fees into tuition. UO rolled-in only undergraduate universal resource fees into tuition. OIT and OSU did not roll-in any fees into tuition. All seven OUS campuses have until fall 2011 to complete undergraduate resource fee roll-in to tuition rates. Consistent with the 2007-2009 Legislative Budget Note, resident undergraduate tuition rates, systemwide, did not increase above 3.4%.
- [24] Dixie State College (DSC) changed its name from Dixie College in 2000; it also began offering four-year degrees that year. The lower division rate for a full-time student at Dixie State College of Utah is reported here. Prior to 2006-07 DSC had separate lower division and upper division tuition rates.
- [25] Utah Valley State College moved to the 4-year section of the report beginning in 2001-02. Effective July 1, 2008, Utah Valley University changed its name from Utah Valley State College.
- [26] Full-time tuition for undergraduates is for 45 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for undergraduates at Washington State University is for 30 semester credit hours.
- [27] Academic year 2008-09 tuition and fee data provided for Washington represents a shift in fee reporting to align Washington tuition and fees with the WICHE survey methodology. Previous tuition and fee totals included only S & A and technology fees, whereas beginning in 2008-09 all institutional fees that a majority of full-time students are required to pay in addition to tuition are included. For more information about adjustments to previous years please contact the Washington State Higher Education Coordinating Board."
- [28] Data reflect main campus tuition at the University of Washington.
- [29] Data reflect average rates at Washington State University for all campuses.
- [30] Starting Fall 2003, University of Wyoming changed to a per credit hour charge for full-time students.
- [31] Mesa State College began offering a graduate-level business administration program in Fall 1997.
- [32] Amounts reported are for 15 credit hours based on a per-credit-hour rate. The typical "full-time" graduate course load at Colorado Springs is nine credit hours.
- [33] Graduate rates at the University of Hawaii, Hilo were established in 1998-99.
- [34] In Montana, graduate students taking a "minimum" full-time course load of nine credit hours pay lower tuition than students taking a "typical" full-time load of 12 credit hours. Tuition for a "typical" full-time load is reported.
- [35] The first level graduate rate for a full-time resident student is reported here (UM grad). For academic year 2008-09, advanced graduate resident students will pay \$6,442 and advanced graduate non-resident students will pay \$18,952 at the University of Montana-Missoula.

- [36] Valley City State University began offering graduate degrees Fall 2005. Valley City State University graduate tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 12 credits per semester.
- [37] The Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) allows differential tuition rates for 26 separate graduate programs. Graduate tuition and fees reported here are basic tuition and fee rates applicable to graduate programs within the USHE (not an average of the 26 separate graduate programs).
- [38] Full-time tuition for graduates is for 30 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for graduates at Washington State University is for 20 semester credit hours.

For academic year 2008-09, upper division students paid \$15,426 at Montana State University, Northern; \$16,520 at Montana Tech of the University of Montana; \$17,578 at the University of Montana, Missoula; and \$12,916 at Western Montana College of the University of Montana.
- [42] Beginning with Fall 2006 term, the Board of Regents adopted a non-resident rate of 150% of the undergraduate resident rate. All new undergraduate non-residents and new transfers pay this rate except for Minnesota students who pay the approved reciprocity rate.
- [43] Prince William Sound community college charges the same tuition and fees for residents and non-residents \$116 per credit hour. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30 credit hours for two semesters.
- [44] All tuition and fees are calculated on 24 credit hours annually.
- [45] For 2007-08 academic year, the enrollment fee per unit is \$20 for every community college in California's public system. Therefore, the cost of 15 units per semester is \$600 for the 2007-08 academic year.
- [46] Northeastern Junior College joined the Colorado Community College System in 1997-98 and Colorado Northwestern Community College joined in 1999-2000. Tuition and fees were adjusted to be consistent with other members of the Colorado Community College System. They no longer charge an out-of-district differential.
- [47] The rate for full-time resident & non-resident students attending UM Helena College of Technology was misreported for 2007-08. Full-time resident students paid \$2,978 and full-time non-resident students paid \$7,922.
- [48] Effective July 1, 2007, Community College of Southern Nevada will become College of Southern Nevada.
- [49] Tuition is reported for full-time lower-division courses only. Select baccalaureate programs are offered.

- [50] Effective July 1, 2007, Western Nevada Community College will become Western Nevada College.
- [51] ATVI is now known as Central New Mexico Community College CNM.
- [52] New Mexico Military Institute figures are for tuition and required fees and do not include boarding charges (all students are required to live on campus).
- [53] Northern NM College has become a Four Year college.
- [54] Tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 15 credits per semester.
- [55] Lake Region State College was formerly the University of North Dakota, Lake Region, and Williston State College was formerly the University of North Dakota, Williston. These name changes occurred in July 1999. Minot State University, Bottineau Campus, was formerly North Dakota State University, Bottineau. This name change occurred in July 1997.
- [56] Clatsop Community College capped charges at 12 credit hours prior to 1997-98.
- [57] Oregon Coast Community College is accredited through Chemeketa Community College.
- [58] District policy for Southwestern Oregon Community College allows a person to obtain residency in the district after residing in the district for 90 or more days.
- [59] Tillamook Bay Community College is accredited through Portland Community College.
- [60] Prior to 2006-07 full-time status for Southeast Technical Institute was reported as 12 credits per semester.
- [61] Additional required fees may be charged for facility, technology, and program costs.
- [62] Northwest College indicated that their fees vary by program and did not provide an average fee amount to the Wyoming Community College Commission.
- [63] The nonresident fees are set by each district and are charged in addition to the statewide enrollment fee.
- [64] These California colleges collect an additional nonresident fee from students who are citizens and residents of a foreign country; the fee is for capital outlay expenditures only. This fee may not exceed actual expenditures per FTE student in the prior fiscal year and may not exceed 50 percent of the regular nonresident fee. The fee varies for different campuses.
- [65] College of Eastern Utah reduced non-resident tuition rates in 2008-09.
- [66] These rates reflect the official Washington community college nonresident tuition rates. Individual community colleges have the authority to waive all or a portion of the nonresidential differential, and the majority of the colleges do exercise this waiver authority.

**[67]** In 2007, non-resident was interpreted in the same way that community colleges interpret it as a non-Washington resident rate. For the 2008-2009 survey, it was interpreted as the International non-resident rate. Technical colleges don't verify out-of-state residency and so they are filling out the WICHE survey with International rates as we did for the 2008-2009 survey.

## Appendix A

# The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 2005

The 2005 Carnegie Classification includes all colleges and universities in the United States that are degree-granting and accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education. The 2005 edition classifies institutions according to several different schemes. This publication relies on the “Basic Classification,” which is the most similar to the traditional classification used in previous editions of the Carnegie Classification. The Basic Classification is based on their degree-granting activities in 2003-04 and, for doctorate-granting institutions, other measures of the intensity of their research activity. Definitions for the categories within the Basic Classification scheme are included verbatim from the Carnegie Foundation’s website below. For detailed information on classification procedures, refer to the Carnegie Foundation’s web-based interface, available at <http://www.carnegiefoundation.org/classifications/index.asp>.

### **Doctorate-granting Institutions**

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 20 doctorates in 2003-04. First-professional degrees (J.D., M.D., Pharm.D., etc.) were not counted for the purpose of this criterion, nor were doctoral degrees in audiology or rehabilitation and therapeutic professions, except when we were informed that the degrees were research doctorates. As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

*Level of research activity.* Doctorate-granting institutions were assigned to one of three categories based on a measure of research activity. It is important to note that the groups differentiate solely with respect to level of research activity, not quality or importance.

The analysis was examined on the following correlates of research activity: research & development (R&D) expenditures in science and engineering (S&E; “science and engineering” is defined by NSF to include the social sciences); R&D expenditures in non-S&E fields; S&E research staff (postdoctoral appointees and other non-faculty research staff with doctorates); doctoral conferrals in humanities fields, in social science fields, in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) fields, and in other fields (e.g., business, education, public policy, social work).

### **Master’s Colleges and Universities**

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 50 master’s degrees in 2003-04, but fewer than 20 doctorates (as defined above). Exclusively graduate-level institutions that awarded fewer than 50 master’s degrees and fewer than 20 doctoral degrees were also included. Institutions with lower levels of master’s degree production can be identified in the Graduate Instructional Program classification. As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

*Program size.* Master’s program size was based on the number of master’s degrees awarded in 2003-04. Those awarding at least 200 degrees were included among larger programs; those awarding 100–199 were included among medium programs; and those awarding 50–99 were included among smaller programs. The smaller programs group also includes exclusively-graduate-level institutions that awarded fewer than 50 master’s degrees.

### **Baccalaureate Colleges**

Institutions were included in these categories if bachelor's degrees accounted for at least 10 percent of all undergraduate degrees and they awarded fewer than 50 master's degrees (2003-04 degree conferrals). In addition, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or as Special Focus Institutions.

Institutions where bachelor's degrees represent at least 10 percent but less than half of undergraduate degrees were assigned to the Baccalaureate/Associate's category.

Among institutions where bachelor's degrees represented at least half of all undergraduate degrees, those with at least half of bachelor's degree majors in arts and sciences fields were included in the "Arts & Sciences" group, while the remaining institutions were included in the "Diverse Fields" group.

### **Associate's Colleges**

Institutions were included if their highest degree conferred was the associate's degree or if bachelor's degrees accounted for less than 10 percent of all undergraduate degrees. As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not eligible to be classified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

### **Special Focus Institutions**

The special-focus designation was based on the concentration of degrees in a single field or set of related fields, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Institutions were determined to have a special focus with concentrations of at least 75 percent of undergraduate and graduate degrees. In some cases the percentage criterion was relaxed if an institution identified a special focus on the College Board's Annual Survey of Colleges, or if an institution's only recognized accreditation was from an accrediting body related to the special focus categories.

### **Tribal Colleges and Universities**

These colleges are defined as members of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium,

## Appendix D

### Procedure for Converting Current Dollars To Constant Dollars

The Higher Education Cost Adjustment (HECA), calculated by SHEEO, was used in Tables 3 and 4 to adjust for the effects of inflation. The base year for the constant dollar conversions was 2008.

The formula for the constant dollar conversion is:

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{TF_{Current}}{(HECA_{Current} / HECA_{Base})}$$

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2003-04 shown in Table 2, \$3,473, to 2008 constant dollars is as follows:

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{3,473}{(100/85.3)},$$

where the HECA value for 2008 is 100 and the HECA value for 2003 is 85.3.

## Appendix E Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four-year and two-year institutions in its 15 member states. The data are generally provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices; a small number of individual institutions provide their data directly. Each year, respondents are asked to provide current published tuition and fees data for resident and nonresident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and nonresident students in public two-year colleges. Data are charged to full-time students attending for the full academic year, except special sessions and summer terms. Respondents were asked to indicate tuition and mandatory fees separately. In addition, they are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data.

The 2008 survey was mailed to state governing and coordinating board staff in June 2008. Surveys were returned by August 2008. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. This year's breakdown by institutional type used the "Basic Classification" of the 2005 revision to *The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education*; more information on the Carnegie classifications is available at <http://www.carnegiefoundation.org/classifications/index.asp>.
