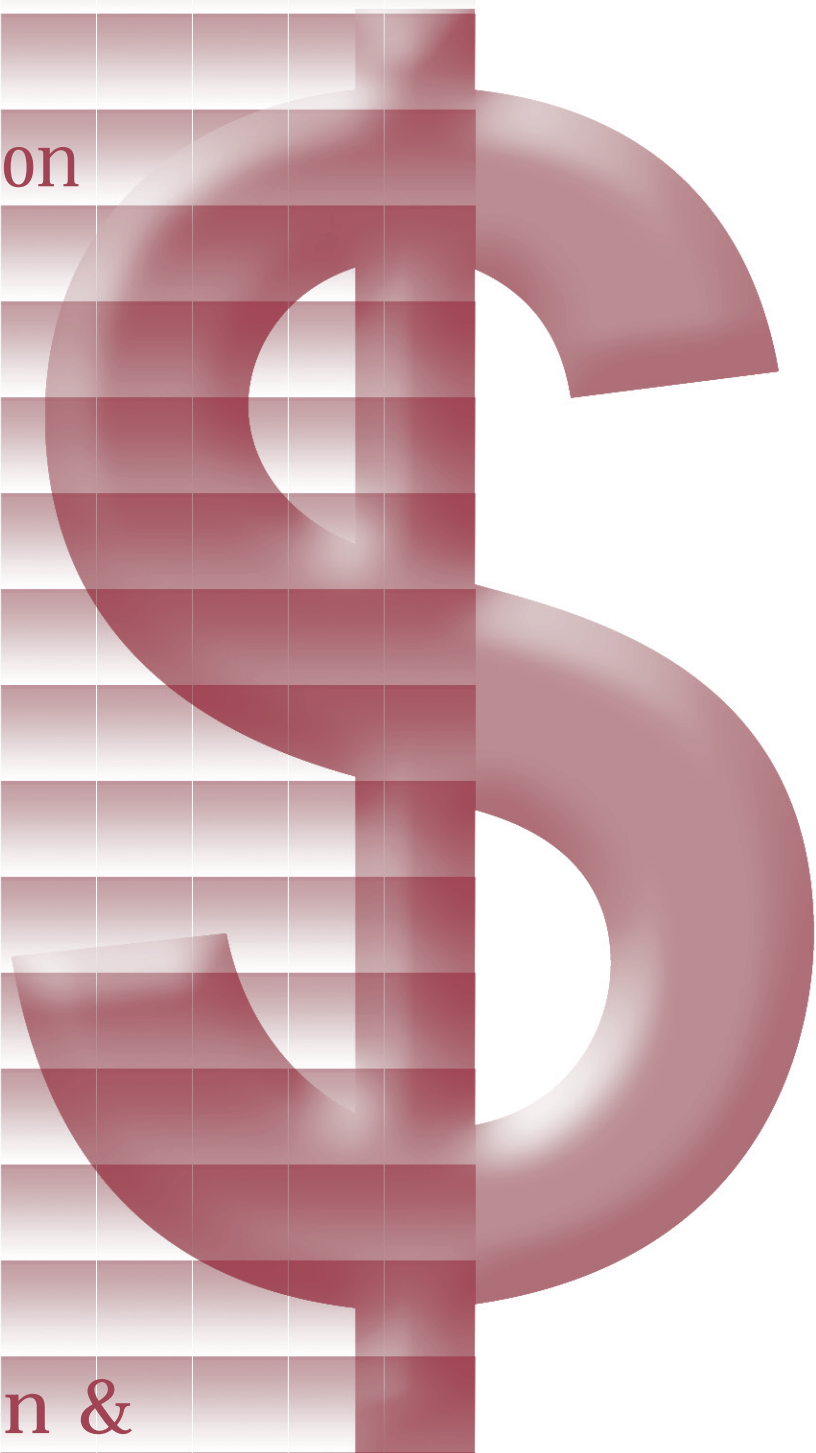

Endnotes

- [1] Average annual increases in tuition and fees are presented with and without California (w/o CA).
- [2] California institutions were excluded from all calculations because the large number of two-year colleges and the historically low matriculation fee structure distort regional patterns.
- [3] This category includes only those colleges that charge a different level of tuition and fees for out-of-district residents.
- [4] The Consumer Price Index (CPI) reflects changes in the price of a fixed basket of goods and services that are purchased by consumers in general. The CPI is the seasonally adjusted Consumer Price Index—Urban (August to August) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- [5] In 2005-06, Alaska resident students are charged \$109 per credit hour for lower division credits, \$123 per upper division credits, and \$244 per credit for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. A surcharge of 2% is added to the tuition. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters.
- [6] All undergraduate and graduate students taking nine or more credits, all students living in university housing, and all students paying the Health Center fee must be covered by a health insurance plan. The student health insurance fee in 2005-06 was \$305 per semester. However students who are covered by an alternative health insurance plan may waive the student health insurance plan.
- [7] Arizona charges additional fees for certain programs: law, pharmacy, nursing, engineering, selected master's degree programs, and undergraduate degree programs at the College of Business at ASU and the UA.
- [8] California State University, Channel Islands opened in 2002-03.
- [9] California State University, Hayward announced in January 2005 that it would change its name to California State University, East Bay.
- [10] California State University, Monterey Bay opened in 1995-96.
- [11] Undergraduate students at the University of California are required to show proof of health insurance, effective Fall 2001. Undergraduate totals do not include waivable health insurance fees.
- [12] University of California, Merced opened in 2005-06.
- [13] University of California, San Francisco offers one undergraduate program in dental hygiene. The undergraduate program is undergoing review, and new enrollments have been suspended during the review.
- [14] The resident undergraduate tuition amounts for all Colorado institutions do not include the \$2,400 voucher for which all Colorado residents taking a full-time undergraduate course load of 30 credit hours at public institutions in Colorado are eligible. Beginning with the 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state will receive an estimated \$80 per credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process.
- [15] Prior to 2003, Colorado State University-Pueblo was the University of Southern Colorado.

- [16] Higher rates apply to certain fields.
- [17] Upper division undergraduate students pay a higher tuition rate.
- [18] Effective AY 2003-04, Hilo discontinued its lower division tuition rate. Hilo undergraduate students previously enrolled in AY 2002-03 as classified freshmen or classified sophomores and continuing their enrollment in Fall 2003 as classified freshmen or classified sophomores were grandfathered in at a lower rate (\$1,792 for residents and \$7,408 for non-residents) for AY 2003-04.
- [19] The 2005 Idaho Legislature changed state law (House Bill 231, Idaho Code 33-3717) regarding the charging of "tuition" to resident undergraduate students. Previously, Idaho statute did not allow the cost of instruction to be charged to resident undergraduates who were charged a "matriculation fee" instead. Beginning July 1, 2005, Boise State University, Idaho State University, and Lewis-Clark State College charge "tuition fees" instead of a "matriculation fee". Matriculation fees will continue to be charged to resident undergraduates at the University of Idaho because the Idaho constitution would have to be amended to effect a similar change at that institution.
- [20] The lower division rate for a full-time student is reported here. For 2005-06, upper division students paid \$4,844 at Montana State University, Northern; \$5,540 at Montana Tech of the University of Montana; \$4,706 at the University of Montana, Missoula; and \$4,465 at Western Montana College of the University of Montana.
- [21] Great Basin College began offering select four-year degrees in academic year 1999-2000. The tuition indicated is for full-time upper-division classes.
- [22] Nevada State College opened in 2002-03.
- [23] Mayville State University includes \$854 notebook computer fee effective 1997-98.
- [24] Valley City State University includes an \$854 notebook computer fee effective 1996-97 which increased to \$902 effective 2001-02. Valley City State University undergraduate tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 15 credits per semester.
- [25] In 2002, Oregon State University added a branch campus in Bend, Oregon: Oregon State University-Cascades campus. Tuition and required fees are equivalent to those of Oregon State University-Corvallis campus.
- [26] Dixie State College changed its name from Dixie College in 2000; it also began offering four-year degrees that year. The lower division rate for a full-time student at Dixie State College of Utah is reported here. For 2005-06, upper division students paid \$2352 in tuition and \$382 in fees.
- [27] Southern Utah University reports lower-division amount here. Upper-division tuition is \$2352 and upper-division fees are \$382.
- [28] In Fall 1995, Utah State University switched from a linear to a plateau tuition schedule.
- [29] Utah Valley State College moved to the four-year section of the report beginning in 2001-02.
- [30] Full-time tuition for undergraduates is for 45 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for undergraduates at Washington State University is for 30 semester credit hours.
- [31] Data reflect main campus tuition at the University of Washington.

- [32] Data reflect average rates at Washington State University for all campuses.
- [33] Starting Fall 2003, University of Wyoming changed to a per credit hour charge for full-time students. This price is for a full-time student of 12 undergraduate hours or 9 graduate hours per semester. The 2003-04 cost appears lower than the 2002-03 cost because the change was made to make it cost-neutral for most full-time students with an average of 15 undergraduate hours or 11 graduate hours per semester.
- [34] Mesa State College began offering a graduate-level business administration program in Fall 1997.
- [35] Amounts reported are for 15 credit hours based on a per-credit-hour rate. The typical "full-time" graduate course load at Colorado Springs is nine credit hours.
- [36] Graduate rates at the University of Hawaii, Hilo were established in 1998-99.
- [37] In Montana, graduate students taking a "minimum" full-time course load of nine credit hours pay lower tuition than students taking a "typical" full-time load of 12 credit hours. Tuition for a "typical" full-time load is reported.
- [38] The first level graduate rate for a full-time student is reported here (UM grad). For academic year 2005-06, advanced graduate students paid \$5,881 at the University of Montana-Missoula.
- [39] The first level graduate rate for a full-time student is reported here (UM non-grad). For academic year 2005-06, advanced graduate students paid \$15,452 at the University of Montana-Missoula.
- [40] Valley City State University began offering graduate degrees Fall 2005. Valley City State University graduate tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 12 credits per semester.
- [41] Oregon Institute of Technology began offering a master's degree program in 1995-96.
- [42] The Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) allows differential tuition rates for 24 separate graduate programs. Graduate tuition and fees reported here are basic tuition and fee rates applicable to graduate programs within the USHE (not an average of the 24 separate graduate programs).
- [43] Full-time tuition for graduates is for 30 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for graduates at Washington State University is for 20 semester credit hours.
- [44] Graduate rates at the University of Washington reflect those for graduate tier I.
- [45] In 2005-06, nonresident students pay a surcharge of \$254 per credit hour. Therefore, they are charged \$363 per credit hour for lower division credits, \$377 for upper division credits, and \$498 per credit hour for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. A surcharge of 2% is added to the tuition. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters.
- [46] California State University nonresident tuition is \$339 per unit at semester campuses and \$226 per unit at quarter campuses. The total charge per academic year is \$10,170 plus the State University Fee and campus-based mandatory fees.

APPENDICES

The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 2000

The 2000 Carnegie Classification includes all colleges and universities in the United States that are degree-granting and accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education. The 2000 edition classifies institutions based on their degree-granting activities from 1995-96 through 1997-98. For definitions and detailed information on classification procedures, refer to the [Technical Notes](#). In addition, important limitations are documented in [The 2000 Carnegie Classification: Background and Description](#).

Doctorate-granting Institutions

Doctoral/Research Universities—Extensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. During the period studied, they awarded 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines.

Doctoral/Research Universities—Intensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. During the period studied, they awarded at least ten doctoral degrees per year across three or more disciplines, or at least 20 doctoral degrees per year overall.

Master's Colleges and Universities

Master's Colleges and Universities I: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. During the period studied, they awarded 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.

Master's Colleges and Universities II: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. During the period studied, they awarded 20 or more master's degrees per year.

Baccalaureate Colleges

Baccalaureate Colleges—Liberal Arts: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. During the period studied, they awarded at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

Baccalaureate Colleges—General: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. During the period studied, they awarded less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges: These institutions are undergraduate colleges where the majority of conferrals are below the baccalaureate level (associate's degrees and certificates). During the period studied, bachelor's degrees accounted for at least ten percent of undergraduate awards.

Associate's Colleges

These institutions offer associate's degree and certificate programs but, with few exceptions, award no baccalaureate degrees.¹ This group includes institutions where, during the period studied, bachelor's degrees represented less than 10 percent of all undergraduate awards.

Specialized Institutions

These institutions offer degrees ranging from the bachelor's to the doctorate and typically award a majority of degrees in a single field. The list includes only institutions that are listed as separate campuses in the 2000 Higher Education Directory. Specialized institutions include:

Theological seminaries and other specialized faith-related institutions: These institutions primarily offer religious instruction or train members of the clergy.

Medical schools and medical centers: These institutions award most of their professional degrees in medicine. In some instances, they include other health professions programs, such as dentistry, pharmacy, or nursing.

Other separate health profession schools: These institutions award most of their degrees in such fields as chiropractic, nursing, pharmacy, or podiatry.

Schools of engineering and technology: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in technical fields of study.

Schools of business and management: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in business or business-related programs.

Schools of art, music, and design: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in art, music, design, architecture, or some combination of such fields.

Schools of law: These institutions award most of their degrees in law.

Teachers colleges: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in education or education-related fields.

Other specialized institutions: Institutions in this category include graduate centers, maritime academies, military institutes, and institutions that do not fit any other classification category.

Tribal Colleges and Universities

These colleges are, with few exceptions, tribally controlled and located on reservations. They are all members of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium.

Appendix D Procedure for Converting Current Dollars To Constant Dollars

The Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), published by the Commonfund Institute, was used in Tables 3 and 4 to adjust for the effects of inflation. The base year for the constant dollar conversions was 2005. The HEPI is available from the Commonfund Institute's website at <http://www.commonfund.org/Commonfund/Investor+Services/HEPI.htm?m=h&AA=2>

The formula for the constant dollar conversion is:

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{TF_{Current}}{(HEPI_{Current} / HEPI_{Base})}$$

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2000-01 shown in Table 2, \$2,713, to 2005 constant dollars is as follows:

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{2,713}{(196.9/239.5)},$$

where the HEPI value for 2005 is 239.5 and the HEPI value for 2000 is 196.9.

Appendix E Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four-year and two-year institutions in its 15 member states. The data are generally provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices; a small number of individual institutions provide their data directly. Each year, respondents are asked to provide current published tuition and fees data for resident and nonresident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and nonresident students in public two-year colleges. Data are charged to full-time students attending for the full academic year, except special sessions and summer terms. For the first time this year, they were asked to indicate tuition and mandatory fees separately. In addition, they are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data.

The 2005 survey was mailed to state governing and coordinating board staff in May 2005. Surveys were returned by November 2005. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. This year's breakdown of institutions by Carnegie Classification used *A Classification of Institutions of Higher Education: 2000 Edition* (Carnegie Foundation, 2000) or self-reported data from IPEDS 2003 Institutional Characteristics Survey (National Center for Education Statistics Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System).
