- [2] State policy requires that nonresident tuition recover 80 percent of operating expenses. Tuition was adjusted in 1996 and 1997 to bring these institutions into compliance.

# **APPENDICES**

### Appendix A The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education

Four-year institutions of higher education are classified using the 1994 edition of the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education. The 1994 classification scheme groups institutions on the basis of the highest level of degrees awarded, number of degrees awarded, level of federal research support (for research institutions), and selectivity of admissions (for baccalaureate institutions).

Two significant changes were made to the classification scheme. First, the comprehensive category was renamed "Master's (Comprehensive)." It includes institutions awarding both bachelor's and master's degrees. Institutions are classified as Master's I or Master's II based on the number of master's degrees awarded. Enrollment is no longer a factor. Second, the liberal arts category is now called "Baccalaureate (Liberal Arts)." Baccalaureate I and Baccalaureate II institutions are primarily undergraduate institutions that are distinguished based on the percent of degrees they award in the liberal arts and the selectivity of their admissions.

The descriptions of the classifications that follow are taken from A Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 1994 Edition (Carnegie Foundation, 1994).

**Research Universities I**: These institutions offer a full range of baccalaureate programs, are committed to graduate education through the doctorate, and give high priority to research. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees each year.<sup>1</sup> In addition, they receive annually \$40 million in federal support.<sup>2</sup>

**Research Universities II:** These institutions offer a full range of baccalaureate programs, are committed to graduate education through the doctorate, and give high priority to research. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees each year. In addition, they receive annually between \$15.5 million and \$40 million in federal support.

**Doctoral Universities I:** In addition to offering a full range of baccalaureate programs, the mission of these institutions includes a commitment to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least 40 doctoral degrees annually in five or more disciplines.

**Doctoral Universities II:** In addition to offering a full range of baccalaureate programs, the mission of these institutions includes a commitment to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least 10 doctoral degrees annually in three or more disciplines, or 20 or more doctoral degrees in one or more disciplines.

**Master's (Comprehensive) Universities and Colleges I:** These institutions offer a full range of baccalaureate programs and are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 40 or more master's degrees annually in three or more disciplines.

**Master's (Comprehensive) Universities and Colleges II:** These institutions offer a full range of baccalaureate programs and are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 20 or more master's degrees annually in one or more disciplines.

**Baccalaureate (Liberal Arts) Colleges I:** These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate degree programs. They are selective in admissions and award 40 percent or more of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.<sup>3</sup>

**Baccalaureate (Liberal Arts) Colleges II:** These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate degree programs. They are less selective in admissions or they award less than 40 percent of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

**Professional Schools and Specialized Institutions:** These institutions offer degrees ranging from the bachelor's to the doctorate. At least 50 percent of the degrees awarded by these institutions are in a specialized field.<sup>4</sup>

### Appendix C Procedure for Converting Current Dollars To Constant Dollars

The Higher Education Price Index (HEPI) published by Research Associates of Washington was used in Tables 3 and 4 to adjust for the effects of inflation. The base year used for the constant dollar conversions is 1991.

The formula for the constant dollar conversion is:

Constant dollars = tuition times {the ratio of HEPI base year vs. HEPI current year}

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2001-02 shown in Table 3 to 1991 constant dollars is as follows:

2001-02 tuition in constant 1991 dollars = \$2843 \* 71.8% = \$2,041

### Appendix D Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four-year and two-year institutions in its 15 member states. The data are provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices. Each year, the staff are asked to provide current tuition and fees data for resident and nonresident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and nonresident students in public two-year colleges. In addition, staff are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data.

The 2001 survey was mailed to state governing and coordinating board staff in June 2001. Staff were asked to provide tuition and fees data for 2001-2002, and to verify and revise, if necessary, the reported data for 2000-01, 1996-97, and 1991-92. All surveys were returned by October 2001. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. This year's breakdown of institutions by Carnegie Classification used *A Classification of Institutions of Higher Education: 1994 edition* (Carnegie Foundation, 1994).
