

Dear Friends and Partners.

As the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) approaches 70 years of serving students in the West, we remain committed to offering programs that provide students with access to affordable postsecondary education options.

Through WICHE's three Student Access Programs, students complete highquality academic education, ultimately prepared for jobs that address our region's most pressing workforce needs. As the world changes, WICHE is working with our partners to ensure these three programs meet the rapidly evolving needs of students, institutions, and the WICHE region, including those in rural areas and hard-to-staff professional niches.

Collectively, the three Student Access Programs below have helped nearly 50,000 students save \$560.6 million this year alone, and WICHE member states and territories invested \$13.7 million to maintain and grow their healthcare workforce in vital whole health fields such as optometry, dentistry, and physical therapy.

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) started in 1988

The largest of WICHE's three Student Access Programs helps nearly 50,000 Western undergraduates save on nonresident tuition — a record enrollment level for this foundational initiative.

Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) started in 1981

WRGP provides opportunities for students across the West to save on nonresident tuition at approximately 1,700 graduate programs at 63 Western institutions.

Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP) started in 1953

PSEP provides affordable access to 10 professional healthcare programs. This program increases the supply of healthcare practitioners, including physicians, dentists, optometrists, physical therapists, veterinarians, and other professionals.

We invite you to explore this report, which outlines vital data about our three Student Access Programs for the 2021–22 academic year. In particular, you will find participation and migration statistics for each program, shared in aggregate and by each WICHE state and territory. You will also find summaries that provide reference points for multiple stakeholders — students and their families, high school counselors and campus advisors, institutional leaders, and policymakers.

INTRODUCTION

STUDENT ACCESS PROGRAMS

The Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) operates programs that support three distinctive educational levels: undergraduate, graduate, and professional healthcare studies. **The overarching goal of each program is to lower the cost of tuition.**

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

WUE, the nation's largest regional tuition-savings program, celebrates its 34th year in AY 2021-22. The program allows students from WICHE states and Pacific Island members to enroll in participating two- or four-year public colleges or universities located in another WICHE state or territory and pay reduced tuition. Students can choose from hundreds of majors at 164 institutions. Students also pay no more than 150% of that school's resident tuition (often much less than the nonresident tuition they'd usually pay).



Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP)

WRGP allows graduate certificate, master's, and doctoral students who are residents of WICHE states and Pacific Island members to affordably enroll in more than 1,700 graduate programs at 63 public institutions in the West. Participating students can enroll as nonresidents, but only pay up to 150% of resident tuition, though the majority of WRGP institutions charge students resident tuition. A WRGP student typically pays about half of what they would have had to pay as a nonresident.



Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP)

Through PSEP, students from Western states and territories can pursue careers in 10 health fields ranging from optometry to dentistry to veterinary medicine. They can enroll in 130+ participating programs across state lines, receiving substantial tuition support from their home state or territory. These high-demand professionals are vitally important, especially in underserved rural and remote areas of the West. Educating more of them is crucial. WICHE reduces the financial strain for students pursuing professional healthcare degrees, especially in less populated states and territories.

WUE

WESTERN UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE

In academic year AY 2021-22, 46,170 WUE students and their families saved more than \$503 million **in tuition.** Despite the challenges faced by higher education during the COVID-19 pandemic, WUE enrollment overall increased by 8.7% from AY 2020-21, bucking the national trend of a 3.1% decrease in undergraduate enrollment. Compared to pre-pandemic AY 2019-20, WUE four-year enrollments were up 12%. Meanwhile, WUE two-year enrollments were down 17% compared to AY 2019–20, similar to community college enrollments nationwide. But the impressive increase with WUE four-year enrollments, overall, belies substantial state and institutional variation. WUE fouryear enrollments increased substantially compared to AY 2019-20 in Hawai'i (25%), Montana (38%), New Mexico (33%), and Utah (30%). But WUE four-year enrollments declined in California (10%), South Dakota (10%), Washington (6%), and Wyoming (6%) over the past two years. In many cases, a single institution or a few drive the state-level increases, with many other institutions showing decreases.

Since the WUE student counts do not distinguish between new and continuing students, it's not possible to know what portion of the WUE enrollment changes are from incoming freshmen or retention. For example, decreases each year could be outgoing WUE graduates replaced or not by new enrollments, and some effect from retention levels with continuing WUE students. Another consideration in assessing WUE enrollment changes is that many of the Western states were predicted to experience overall enrollment increases due to population demographics.

The significant tuition savings WUE offers is just one benefit for students; they also benefit from increased choice of educational offerings. Some students, for example, gain affordable access to majors not offered in their home state. When varying tuitions and cost-of-living are factored in, WUE makes out-of-state study more affordable for most students and their families.

Most WUE institutions make all or most majors available at the WUE rate, but some may exclude select high-demand majors. Transfer students can also qualify for the WUE rate at nearly all participating institutions. And though institutions may choose to set more stringent admissions standards for WUE students, many award the WUE rate to all nonresident WICHE-region applicants who would qualify under normal admissions criteria.


Western states also benefit greatly from their public colleges and universities' participation in WUE (territories and freely associated states also have the potential to benefit). WUE helps these schools meet their recruitment and enrollment goals. WUE schools determine their WUE admissions requirements and which majors are WUE-eligible. Students apply directly to their preferred WUE institution(s). Some graduates stay in the state where they studied — a bonus for states seeking to bolster and diversify their collegeeducated workforce. For states with more demand for public higher education than capacity, WUE serves as an effective relief valve, allowing their residents access to a postsecondary education without having to entirely bear the financial burden of increasing capacity at home.

WRGP

WESTERN REGIONAL GRADUATE PROGRAM

In AY 2021–22, 2,947 students saved nearly \$43.8 million in tuition through WRGP. The additional 500+ graduate students using WRGP this year marks an increase of 21% from AY 2020–21. Nationally, graduate/ professional enrollment at public four-year institutions saw an increase of only 1%. WRGP institutions see the value of WRGP as a tool to attract talent by offering affordable options. Cooperating institutions chose to make an additional 350 graduate programs available through WRGP this year; more than 1,700 WRGP offerings are now available at reduced cost for nonresidents from institutions in the WICHE region.

Participating public universities in the WICHE region also benefit from WRGP. The program helps attract and incentivize a broader and more diverse pool of students to pursue varied disciplines at their public institutions. WRGP allows residents of WICHE members to take advantage of niche programs regionwide without having to pay nonresident tuition premiums.

The pandemic has underscored the need for professionals in high-demand fields such as supply chain management, cybersecurity, health care, and more. WRGP remains a noteworthy option for


students pursuing advanced degrees in high-need fields, particularly for healthcare related degrees not offered through WICHE's Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP), see page 10, such as nurse practitioner. Additionally, a growing number of WRGP programs are offered online, enabling place-bound students to grow their educational credentials.

PROFESSIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The pandemic continues to amplify the need for health professionals across a range of fields, and underserved urban and rural communities alike are facing shortages of practitioners. The Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP) has been and continues to be a critically important mechanism for Western states to increase the supply of physicians, dentists, optometrists, veterinarians, and other healthcare professionals. For nearly 70 years, WICHE member states and territories have supported the education of 15,630 Western residents with affordable access to professional healthcare degrees through PSEP.

In AY 2021–22, 10 WICHE states and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands invested more than \$13.7 million to grow their healthcare workforce by reducing the educational costs of 543 students. More than 130 accredited programs are offered through PSEP at 60 institutions.


Participating healthcare programs benefit from the geographic, economic, and demographic diversity that PSEP students bring to their classrooms.

Thanks to PSEP, a student can save between \$34,000 and \$133,600 on tuition over the lifespan of a professional health degree program, depending on the field of study. This reduced fiscal strain enables students to afford to work in rural areas that typically pay lower salaries compared to urban areas, or to pursue professional options that are less lucrative but sorely needed. Most states and territories that support PSEP students require graduates to return home and practice for up to four years, ensuring that their investment supports the healthcare professions its residents need most.



PSEP GRADUATE RETURN RATES, AY 2007-16

Because states and territories supporting students through PSEP want their investments to bolster their healthcare workforces, every five years WICHE calculates the percentage of PSEP graduates who return home to serve their communities. Return rates for students who graduated between AY 2007 and AY 2016 held relatively steady compared to the prior reporting period. The average student return rate for PSEP states is now 67%.



The return rate is calculated every 5 years.

Six states supporting PSEP students — Arizona, Colorado, Hawai'i, Nevada, New Mexico, and Wyoming — require graduates to return home to practice or reimburse funds plus interest paid by states on their behalf. Hawai'i and Wyoming recently implemented this requirement, known as "service payback," so they were not included among service payback states in the most recent cycle's calculations.

WICHE's service-payback states get higher returns on investment from PSEP participation, averaging an 83% return rate. The state of Washington required its graduates to return when it was still using the program through 2014, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands will require service payback for its future PSEP graduates.

"Honor-system" states (Alaska, Montana, North Dakota, and Utah) do not contractually require service payback, and their average return rate is 51%. Hawai'i and Wyoming were included in this group for the most recent year statistics, but WICHE anticipates their return rates will improve markedly in future reporting cycles due to their switch to a service-payback model. Idaho was an "honor state" when it was using the program through 2013.

WICHE states and Pacific Island members pay annual dues on a fiscal year basis (July 1–June 30 each year). The dues for fiscal year 2022 were \$159,000 per WICHE member.

Residents of the WICHE region can participate in two of our three Student Access Programs — the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) and the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP). Public and private universities in the WICHE region that offer professional healthcare degrees may also enroll students from other states and territories through WICHE's Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP).

Legislatures in the region may also decide to appropriate funds to reduce tuition costs for its students enrolled through PSEP for their professional healthcare studies; currently 10 states and Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) enroll students through PSEP.

This fiscal year, WICHE state and Pacific Island members reaped an average 14,159% return on investment (ROI) on membership dues.

The value of WICHE goes beyond participation in WICHE's Student Access Programs. The tuition dollars that come to the institutions and the positive economic and workforce impact created by inbound students adds to the many benefits. WICHE members also gain tremendous value from WICHE's expertise and initiatives in higher education policy, training of behavioral health professionals, facilitation and policy support of online learning and student credit transfer programs, among many others.


WUE STUDENTS BY STATE ALASKA STUDENTS SAVED \$15.8 MILLION






WRGP STUDENTS BY STATE ARIZONA STUDENTS SAVED \$2.4 MILLION
















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WUE STUDENTS BY STATE SOUTH DAKOTA STUDENTS SAVED \$3.5 MILLION





PROFESSIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

81 students paid reduced tuition and saved \$2.1 million for healthcare studies not offered by public institutions in the home state.

The University of Wyoming and the local economy can benefit from PSEP. Its doctor of pharmacy program can enroll students from other WICHE states. The institution receives a support fee paid by the students' home states to reduce their tuition costs.

42% of Wyoming's PSEP graduates returned home to practice (2007–11 for physicians, 2007–16 for all other fields). Students (enrolling as of Fall 2013 or later) are now required to return home and practice upon graduation. Students studying veterinary medicine are currently exempt.






WUE STUDENTS BY STATE WYOMING STUDENTS SAVED \$5.9 MILLION
