Educational quality, stability, and sustainability assessed by peer evaluators against standards, eligibility requirements, and policies


Institutions qualify for Federal Title IV funds and

Evolving Bachelor's Degree


- ► Stackable
- ► Reduced Time to Degree
 - Less than the typical four years
- Reduced Credits to Degree
 - Less than recognized standard of at least 120 credits
- ► Requires review by accrediting agency

Transfer

- ► Well-Defined Articulation Agreements
 - ► Common-Course Numbering, if available
- ► Prior Learning Assessments & Military Credit
- ► Clear and Transparent Policies and Processes
- ► Familiarity with IPEDS Reporting
 - ► Need to report if your students are transferring
